New Testament Survey: Gospel of Luke (3/27)

Invitation Materials

Author:

- While the book is anonymous, traditionally it is thought to be the work of Luke the physician, Paul's co-worker and companion (Col 4:14; 2 Tim 4:11).
- 2 Luke is the only non-Jewish author in the NT books.
- 3 Gospel of Luke is Volume I (Story of Jesus), and Acts is Volume II (Story of the church).

Date:

Uncertain; probably sometimes after the fall of Jerusalem in A.D. 70.

Theme:

Jesus is the Savior of the whole world.

Historical Background:

- 1 Luke wrote the record of Jesus' life for a Gentile audience.
- 2 In 1:3, he addresses the book to Theophilus, an unknown but probably wealthy Roman aristocrat.

Characteristics

- 1 Luke is the longest book in the NT.
- 2 It is marked by joy (1:46-47; 15:8-32; 24:52-53), songs of praise (1:46-55; 68-79; 2:14; 29-32).
- 3 The book has an interest in the relationship of Jesus with people considered outcasts by his fellow countrymen (e.g., women, children, the poor, tax-collectors and Samaritans).
- 4 Luke's Gentile orientation is seen in the fact that Jesus' genealogy is traced back to Adam(3:38), the founder of human race, rather than back to Abraham, the founder of the Jewish race (Mt 1:1).
- 5 Luke seldom quotes the OT like Matthew.
- 6 The book tells how the promised Messiah is indeed the Savior of the whole world.
